**Did you know...?**

**At our school, we use Coram Life SCARF (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience, Friendship) to teach our PSHE sessions. This whole-school approach supports children's health and wellbeing and is aligned with National Standards.**

**The SCARF scheme of work helps pupils develop essential life skills and knowledge. It covers key topics such as emotional wellbeing, healthy lifestyles, relationships, and safety, and provides age-appropriate activities and lessons. Through discussions, role-play, and interactive tasks, pupils learn to navigate social situations, make informed choices, and understand the importance of both physical and mental health. It also supports a safe and inclusive classroom environment where pupils can build confidence, resilience, and a sense of responsibility.**

**We also hold termly whole-school PSHE assemblies linked to our learning topics. Coram Life supports our Relationship and Sex Education curriculum**

too, and a specialist delivers sessions to all Key Stage 2 classes. Our PSHE teaching also closely links to British Values and Protected Characteristics.
